

"to prevent genetic isolation, allow for species migration, and maintain and enhance healthy ecosystems"












Which type of public funding do you rely on the most: regional, national, or EU funds?






Within private financing which instrument have you used the most?



The goals

To develop an innovative financial mechanism to:


• **Fund** the Prioritized Action Framework for Natura 2000 in Lombardy Region.

- Implement the Regional Biodiversity and Sustainable Development Strategy.
- Involve the private sector and citizens in nature restoration activities.





Key elements



1. A public grant of 3.5 millions €:

- to incentivise biodiversity conservation and forest climate adaptation measures;
- to leverage private finance for conservation.

2. A business model for applicants (N2000 managers):

- to measure ES impacts using FSC procedures;
- to have sponsors committed to support ecosystem services.


3. A technical assistance to support regional parks:

- in identifying the right interventions and carry out FSC certification;
- in finding the right sponsors.



The FSC® ecosystem services procedure

- The Forest Stewardship Council® (FSC) is the most globally trusted and recognized voluntary, independent and third-party certification system for the responsible management of the world's forests;
- In 2018 FSC launched its <u>Procedure for the certification of</u> <u>Ecosystem Services</u>: an additional tool for demonstrating and communicating positive impacts on...



Public-private finance model




How do we engage with the private sector

 We ensure all private companies comply with impact claims using the FSC standards

Key results (1)



30 regional entities expressed interests, 18 applied and 12 regional parks obtained the public financing

- forest management improvement: 298.7 ha
- reforestation: 20.93 ha
- habitats upgraded: 135.9
- more than 90 plant species (tree, shrub, herbaceous, aquatic, and liana species) planted and 27 species (animals)
- new certified areas under FSC standard: 3.128 ha (10 parks)

signed contracts for sponsorships worth 1.3 million euros for certified ecosystem services with 79 private companies



































































Conclusions

- First attempt of blended finance at regional level
 - not easy to set up, not easy to manage, but we learned a lot
- Lombardy Region is planning on launching a new phase, involving financial sector as cofinancers
- Great opportunity for N2000 managers
- Technical assistance is necessary to fill the gap

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


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Next EU Multi-Annual Financial Framework MFF

What will EU funding look like in 2027 to 2032?

- Overall MFF envelope smaller
- New additional priorities
- Proposed major changes to structure
- National envelopes MS choose how to allocate funds to each policy
- LIFE programme split





Opportunities to mainstream biodiversity

NaturaConnect submission to MFF consultation & scientists letter

- Importance of LIFE, Interreg, Cohesion opportunities
- Earmarking or minimum spend link to Prioritised Action Framework for Natura, GI & species
- Performance-based approach
- Better ex-ante and ex-post assessments
- Better tracking
- Better spending categories how to ensure climate / water / infrastructure spend also delivers for nature
- Better safeguards and proofing DNSH principle, ex-ante & SEA, ex-post evaluations & learning from them, EIA & rules in EU regulations
